Has your home needed major plumbing repairs? Please let us know!

In the past several months the Board has heard from several homeowners about their pipes bursting between the house and the street. Furthermore, the City of Tucson has needed to repair several water main breaks throughout our neighborhood. We've had reports from contractors who performed the repairs that they are *polybutylane pipes* – a home construction material that is no longer allowed. Landscaping improvements increase safety and security in Christopher Creek Wash

You may have noticed some major improvements in the Christopher Creek common area lately. This has been a priority of the Board since mid-2010 due to increased criminal activity near the wash, including: graffiti, questionable pedestrian traffic, and several burglaries in surrounding homes.

A variety of solutions have been considered, including: volunteer graffiti cleanup and special sign coatings, increased lighting to improve visibility, encouraging the establishment of nearby neighborhood watches, and requesting additional police patrols in the area. In this effort, at the June 2011 meeting funding was approved to complete the cleanup of the Christopher Creek common area. With the help of our new landscaping chair, Brenda Hettinger, we've established more rigorous standards for the upkeep of this area, including:

- Trimming tree limbs up above 6 feet, to increase light and visibility within the wash
- Remove brush and debris, to reduce fire hazard and allow correct water drainage. We also ask residents to refrain from disposing trash or landscaping debris into the common areas.
- Repair common wall damage and other structural issues revealed from the cleanup
- Establish (contractual) service rotations requiring <u>all</u> common areas to be addressed at least twice per calendar year by our hired landscaping crew
- Conduct a current landscape inventory to address any dead common area plants/trees (after this winter's hard frost), using the original Riverhaven landscape plan
