Davidson Elementary School Community Garden Under Construction

Construction of a new community garden is getting started at Davidson Elementary School. The community garden will be operated by Tucson Community Gardens. Residents will be able to "lease" a 3ft x 20 ft plot for personal gardening. There will also be a number of garden plots for the school's use. The new community garden includes a ramada with raised planter beds, a circular planting area for trailing vegetables, a garden shed for tools, a drinking fountain and accessible walkways and planters. This project is made possible by funding from Ward 2 and the existing agreement between the City and TUSD.

Recent Crime Activity in Riverhaven

Several vehicle break-ins have occurred throughout Riverhaven in the past couple months. Incidents have been reported on Surging Waters, Parting Waters, Sierra Springs, and River Falls. Each incident featured a car window being smashed and portable goods grabbed from the front seat(s). Several victims reported they left personal bags or electronic goods in the car the night they were robbed – while other cars nearby were not impacted. A small bit of good news is that one victim was able to determine the time and date her stolen credit card was used at a nearby gas station. Tucson Police has been notified and is acquiring the video surveillance from the gas station. Here are a few tips to deter any future incidents:

- Avoid leaving valuables in your car overnight. If items need to be left in your car, try to disguise them under seats or in your trunk where they are not easily seen or accessible.
- Leave your front porch and garage lights on at night to help illuminate the street and your property
- Talk to your neighbors! Consider participating in a Neighborhood Watch or starting your own. Contact Cathy Shull or Tucson Police to learn more.

2012 Budget Meeting

The Riverhaven Board unanimously passed the 2012 budget at the November 9th. The community's finances are in excellent shape and 2011 is looking to close *under budget*. It was determined that there was no need to increase homeowner assessments for 2012. The Board is planning for several projects in the coming year, including: landscaping audit and tree replacements, communal meeting spaces such as a ramada or small playground, and several small infrastructure repairs.
